



I cannot do anything without my staff!




- If the people given control over an organization and have no idea how it works, it will be a disaster!

CASES IN POINT - HOW TO MANAGE?



 Investigator X was asked to submit his approved IRB to be considered for access to dataset A associated with a particular agency. X submitted an IRB protocol that was approved for access to dataset B that is associated with another agency. What should we do with this case?



• Investigator **Y** put in an application for amendment of his existing IRB with half a dozen sub studies, albeit linked to his original study. These studies are different in nature, but yet related to different aspects of human health. What should we do with this case?

RISK MITIGATION PLAN – EXAMPLES OF QUESTIONNAIRE

Awareness

- Is the PI aware of the nature of the dataset (Open, restricted, confidential, classified – OSA)?
- Is the PI aware of the ownership of the dataset?
- Is the PI aware of the data providers' requirements relating to storage requirements?

Assurance

- PI's assurance that that the storage of the dataset complies with the data providers' requirements
- PI's assurance that he/she shall comply with DGP's and specified legal agreement requirements for destruction of the dataset
- PI's assurance that he/she will report incidents of data leakage to the institution and the data provider in accordance with legal agreement requirements






WHAT ELSE HAVE I LEARNT?

CLIPS exhibit genome integrity e after multiple passages - karyoptypic analysis of CLIPS (CLECz3 and CLEC44) and found no abnormalities after prolonged passage (790). In contrast, adult skin fibro (ASF5) exhibit trisomy 1 at passage 30. Beyond this, we cannot sustain whereas CLIPS (CLEC44) continue to grow and exhibit normal karyoty 50 (Fig. 1.1).

Fig. 1.1: Karyotype Analysis of CLIPS and Skin-IPS. Analysis was performed on two CLIPS-CLEC lines (#23 & #44) on 22G-banded metaphases with no abnormal clone detected for CLEC-44 up to passage 50, whereas Trisomy 1 was documented in skin-iPSC (ASF5), and also CLEC-23 at passage 30. Number of cells analyzed for each line at each time point is indicated (n).
